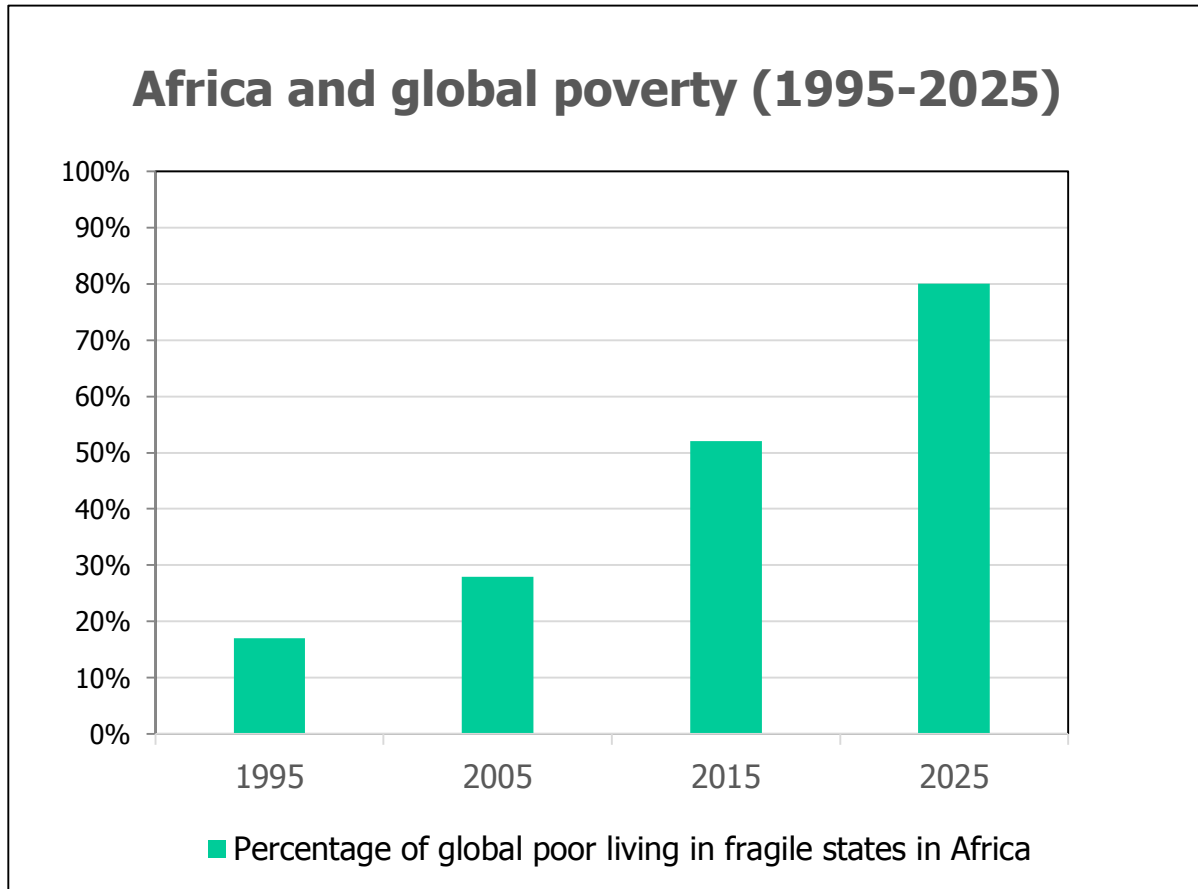

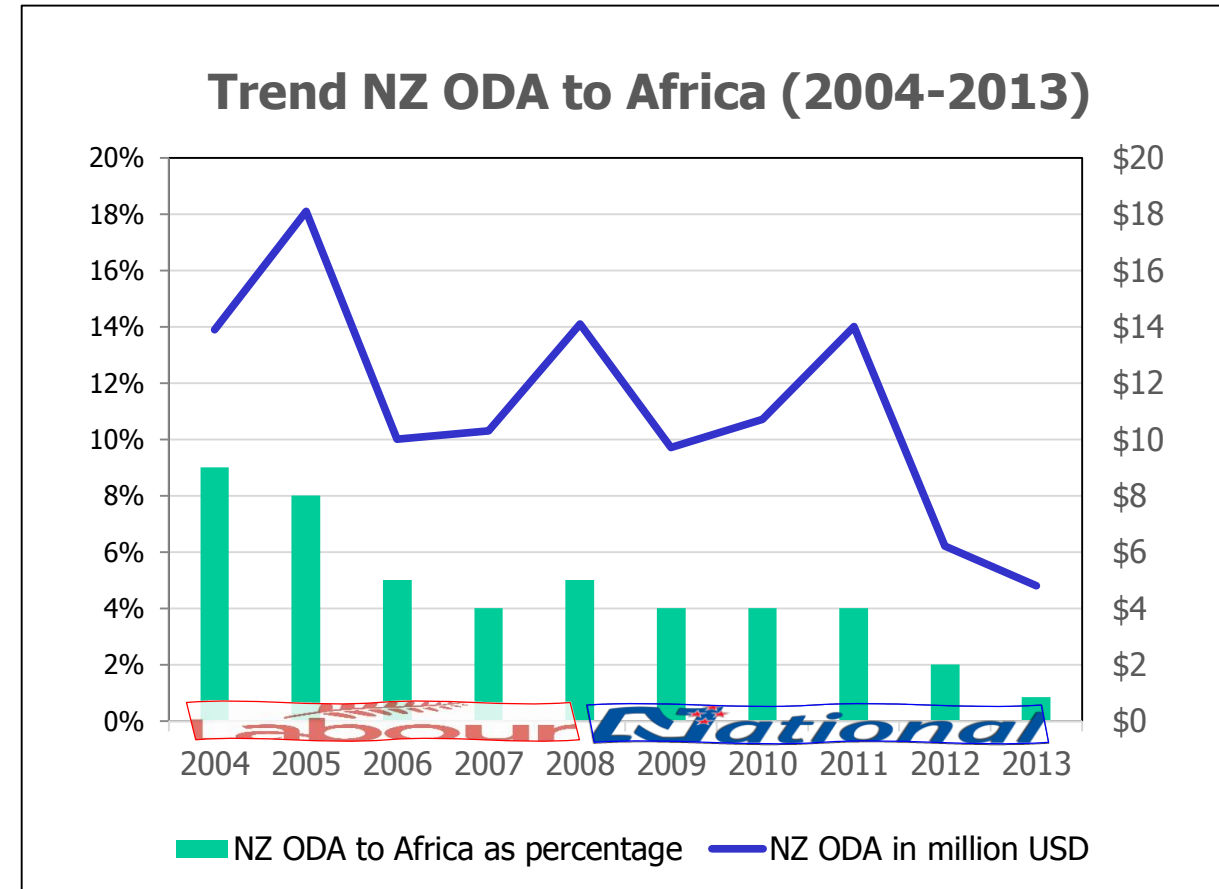

Trends: Africa and global poverty & NZ Aid and Africa



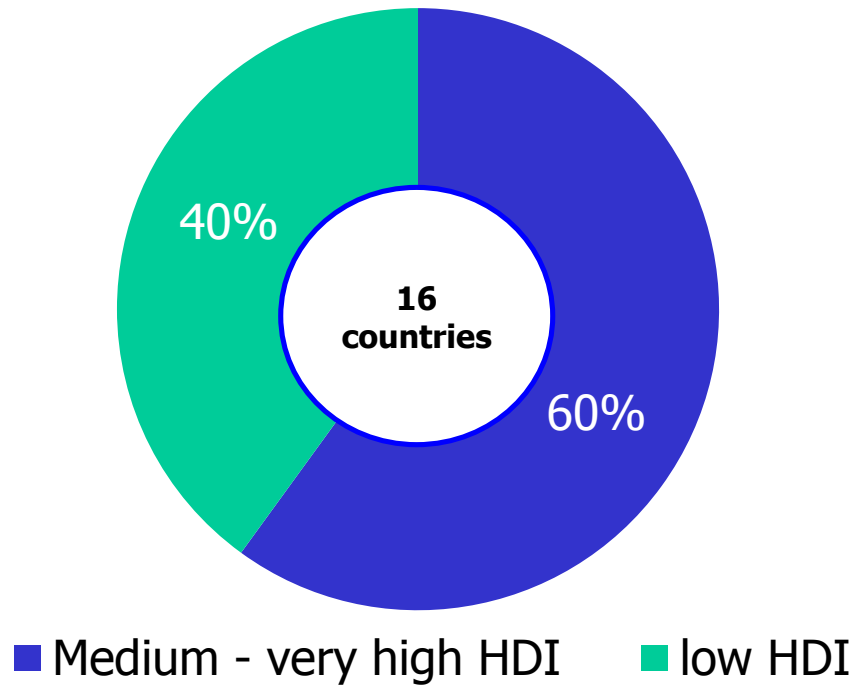
